Dear Father:

Please welcome the ambassadors and volunteers from *Radio Santísimo Sacramento* (1240 AM, 1340 AM, 95.7 FM, 93.3 FM and 92.1 FM) at your parish to promote the radio station among parishioners. This station has proven to be an effective way for the Catholic Church to communicate with the Hispanic community in the greater Sacramento area.

I am pleased to see the success *Radio Santísimo Sacramento* (RSS) which was inaugurated on October 7, 2011, the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. It has surpassed my expectations. The station continues to produce local programs reaching adults and youth. Some of the programs have been picked up for national distribution by the international Catholic network, EWTN Radio. RSS has now expanded the coverage area to include more regions in Northern California purchasing two transmitter stations. These means that more Hispanic Catholic families find companionship and encouragement in living their faith.

Radio Santísimo Sacramento is overseen by a fiduciary board of directors constituted by lay Catholics. The studio is located at the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Though it is an independent entity from the Shrine, the radio station is assisted by the parish. I appreciate the enthusiastic support from both Father Francisco Bracamontes. The operations of the Station are maintained through fund-raising activities, mostly radio-thons and underwriting.

Ambassadors and volunteers from the Radio Station will be visiting from time to time to ask how the Radio can support the parish, share promotional announcements for the radio station, conduct field interviews, gather news, and identify potential underwriter/sponsors for the station. Your cooperation in these endeavors is greatly appreciated.

Join me in praying that this ministry will continue to be an effective tool of Catholic Evangelization. May the intercession of our Blessed Mother, Santa María de Guadalupe, help us communicate the joy and hope of her Son, Jesus.
